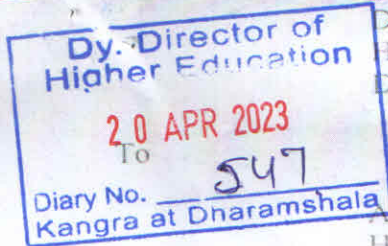
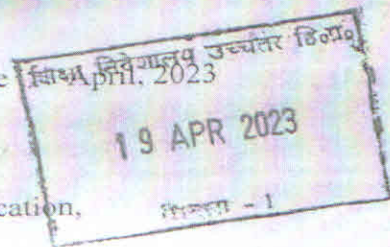

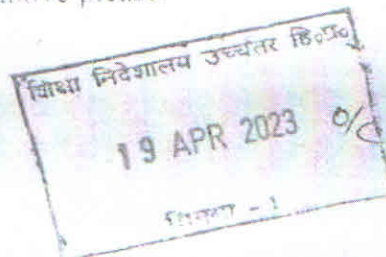

RESOLUTION

The Regional Judicial Colloquium on PoCSO Act, Juvenile Justice & Drug Abuse among Children held in Kochi for the five Southern States of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka and Kerala and the Union Territory of Puducherry conducted by the High Court of Kerala on 25th and 26th February 2023 has resolved to strongly recommend to the Union Government and the State Governments to take proactive steps to establish dedicated drug treatment and rehabilitation centres for children as per the guidelines and directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India as per the judgment dated 14.12.2016 in Writ Petition (Civil) No.906 of 2014 in the case of Bachpan Bachao Andolan v. Union of India (2017) 1 SCC 653 and the provisions of the scheme "Central Sector Scheme of Assistance for Prevention of Alcoholism & Substance (Drugs) Abuse and for Social Defence Services" effective from 1.4.2018, framed by the Government of India in the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment.

Further, the Regional Colloquium has resolved to recommend to the State Governments to implement the Navchetna Life Skills and Drug Education for School Children Module launched by Government of India in all the schools for early prevention of drug abuse.

Further, the Regional Colloquium has also resolved to recommend to the State Governments to conduct awareness and training programs for sensitization and enhancing the capacities of members of Juvenile Justice Board and Child Welfare Committees for the due discharge of their statutory obligations and duties as per the Juvenile Justice Care & Protection Act and also for their intervention in areas of drug prevention cases.

Further, it is also resolved to request the High Courts of the aforesaid States to ensure that the Registrar General of the respective High Courts intimate the above resolution to the competent authority of the Union Government in the Ministry of Social Justice and the State Governments concerned including the Union Territory of Puducherry for information and necessary action.
