



This matter may be accorded top priority.







1.	52	A mechanism should be developed by State/UT Police, involving the local community, in the fight against drug addiction by building up on the societal trust reposed in the Police in this context. Lessons learnt and modus operandi of narcotics suppliers/criminals should be readily shared across forces/agencies to disrupt supply chain networks of narcotics.	IS-II	State/UT Police, NCB, M/o SJE
2.	53	Whole-of-government approach should be adopted to combat drug addiction, and 10 priorities be finalised in this regard, and action taken on them. Similarly, videos of the mothers could focus on how inadequate attention on the part of the parents led them to lose track of their children's addiction journey.
